UPGRADES FIRE CODES FOR A SAFER COMMUNITY

Congratulations Mayor Rodney Pace and Prospect Heights Alderman!

On December 20, 2006, the village unanimously passed a zero fire tolerance ordinance. It includes a zero square foot fire sprinkler threshold for commercial building occupancies, and residential quick response fire sprinklers for all new single family homes following the NFPA 13D Standard for installation. Thus, becoming the 40th Illinois community to do so.

As a result, Prospect Heights will become a fire safe community protecting those who live, work and visit there. It also helps safeguard the firefighters who respond to the incidents.
